RESEARCH COORDINATOR – Full-time position, 3 year contract

The individual will work to support the administration and execution of research projects of important health and health care questions for Northern Ontario. In particular, the Research Coordinator will support primary health care research and health systems evaluation research in Northern Ontario. This person will work closely with Dr. Wood, other researchers, administrators, and collaborators at TBRHRI and the Northern Ontario School of Medicine's Centre for Social Accountability, and health professionals across Northern Ontario to lead collaborative health research that focuses on Northern Ontario priorities.

The ideal candidate is highly motivated and organized, with the ability to multi task in a fast-paced, diverse and growing environment. Exceptional organizational and communication skills, along with strong quantitative, analytic and reasoning skills are necessary. A strong work ethic and positive attitude are key. Strong research methodological skills are required, including knowledge of epidemiologic study designs, and applied statistical methods. Must be familiar with R, SAS, SQL programming languages, and have knowledge and practice of research ethics, data security and privacy, and Indigenous research approaches (including Indigenous data sovereignty). A Master's degree in health services research, epidemiology, clinical science, or related or equivalent combination of education and experience, is required, along with three to five years of relevant experience, particularly participating in health research or clinical services in a northern, rural, or remote context. Preference will be given to those with a PhD in health services research, epidemiology, or related field. French/Indigenous language skill set are considered an asset.
